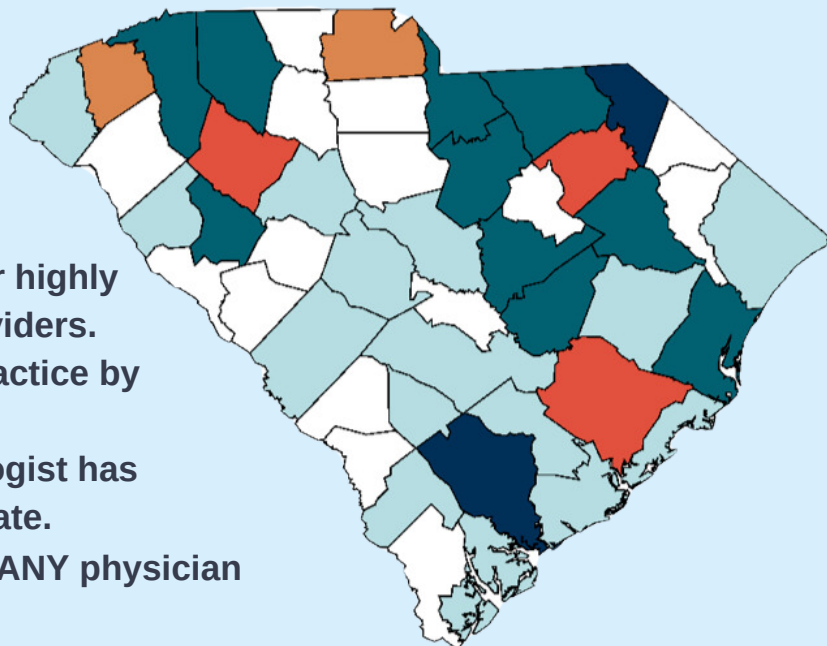

- CRNA's **ALREADY** have full scope of practice by training, certification, and licensure.
- Supervision by a physician anesthesiologist has never been required by statute in any state.
- CRNAs currently can be supervised by ANY physician or dentist in SC.



- South Carolina is ranked 41st [1] for overall healthcare performance, with 23 rural hospitals, [2] three of those critical access hospitals, to serve over 730,000 residents. [3]
- Nearly 1.4 million South Carolina residents live in rural area, facing more challenges in access to healthcare that their urban counterparts. [4]
- Because Efficiency-driven Anesthesia Modeling uses CRNA providers, it may reduce (or even eliminate) the financial burden placed on facilities, help reduce unnecessary healthcare spending and reflect appropriate anesthesia staffing to meet a facility's patient and surgical needs.
- Removing the state-mandated supervision requirement does not mean that an individual facility cannot impose such a requirement, affording South Carolina facilities the flexibility to utilize CRNAs in ways that best enable each facility to meet the needs of the patients and communities they serve.
